


WELCOME TO ARTS CONNECTION

ODAC'S STRATEGIC PLAN

ODAC is a recipient of the Federal Government Community Services Recovery Fund of \$28,000.00. All of the funds will be put towards a local Consultant to work with the ODAC Board members to undertake the research and consultation to provide a Strategic Plan to assist ODAC in financial sustainability to provide services to the arts community and enhancing programs it can bring to Orillia. ODAC, as a non profit organization depends solely on successful applications for government and private grants which leaves very little funding with which to operate.

BUILDING OUR COMMUNITY THROUGH OUTDOOR ART

Orillia has the somewhat unique status as both a tourist destination and a bedroom community. It is likely that the "bedroom" element will prevail in the next decade. How do we retain the ambience of our city while embracing this inevitable change to semi-urban status?

I spent a lot of time in Philadelphia over the years. One thing that emerged in that city was murals. Mural Art Philadelphia started decorating large facades at some point in the 1990s. There were a lot of empty or marginally used factory buildings, warehouses, unsightly commercial structures, and just messy graffiti magnets. What replaced these was a dedicated effort to give voice to artists from all social strata and styles. The street kids with spray cans and the fine artists with graphic backgrounds were encouraged to work together to design and install murals. Many are rather large. All carry a message. In Orillia we have the capacity to enhance our structures and create a greater tourist draw.

Working within the old town as well as the newer sections, mural art can become the transformation many would like to see. It gives voice to those who are currently placing wall art around the city and those who want to develop a more unified, decolonized picture of The Sunshine City.

Chemainus, BC is famous for its murals. These are not simply historic reproductions of old photos, or representations of the colonizing peoples. These are works of art that engage the viewer and encourage discussion. They are an investment in the future of the city.

Cities from St. Louis to Oakland to Los Angeles to New York (and Berlin, Amsterdam, and Paris) are looking to employ the creativity of the many graffiti artists. The idea is to move beyond decorating subway cars to beautifying old buildings.

So – how about we in Orillia initiate a plan to have several murals in place within the next five years? It should not be difficult to locate likely sites, nor to convince the owners to permit the beautification of their buildings. What is needed is the will and encouragement to attack this with fervor. It's time to look into the future and bring out the creativity that is inherent in this town.

What can we do to get this moving? Art in Public Places can recommend. City staff can facilitate. Council can encourage through by-law amendments and inclusion in the Downtown Tomorrow plans. Let's see what the public thinks.


