HISTORY OF ODAC

The Orillia District Art Council (ODAC), is a not-for-profit organization that many artists and citizens have probably heard of but not many actually know what they do and how it impacts artists. This small organization serves the arts and local community's by bringing people and resources together to enrich the cultural, economic, and intellectual life of our community.



ODAC's roots were started by a small group of artists to work with local artists to find ways of helping each other as well as local groups.



They officially became a recognized group.



By 2005 ODAC the organization was incorporated

Work then started on developing a strategic plan and other key documents required to meet the standards of a Charitable Organization. These strategic documents are the cornerstones of ODAC's vision, mission and values followed today.





Even ODAC's logo has a deep routed meaning reflecting its vision of a strong united creative community working together to enhance the culture in our area. It was designed by local artist Rodney Frost in 2007 and represents the many disciplines of art.

Skipping forward to today, ODAC has developed in leaps and bounds. The Board of Directors currently comprised of six, a growing membership of diversified artists and non-artists consisting of over 60 artists.





Funding of programs offered to artists and community groups are derived from public donations and grant applications. All Board Members volunteer their time to find and apply for donations and granting opportunities.



ODAC operates behind the scenes to enhance arts and culture in the Orillia area. A few programs funded in whole or in part by ODAC are Streets Alive, Community Arts Achievement Awards, Expressive Art for Mental Health, Kids art and more.

WENDY COOPER PARKINSON

Orillia based artist Wendy Cooper-Parkinson has maintained a studio art practice for 30 years and exhibited and sold work across the globe.

She works in a variety of media that include drawing, painting, printmaking, collage and enamel on copper. Words and original poetry are often used to construct images. Sometimes they are visible, other times they are not.

A spinal cord injury in 2021 rendered Wendy a quadriplegic. It has altered her daily living and the way she makes art. Adaptive tools and a willingness to explore alternative ways to do what she loves, have added a new dimension to Wendy's art practice, and ongoing desire for expression.
